# The Exam



The changes made to the administration of the test will accommodate those impacted by the spread of the Coronavirus that has interrupted face-to-face learning and review.



Tests will be 45 minutes



Tests will be online and students can take on any device



Tests will be a written exam (no multiple choice)



Tests will cover partial course content; this will be the content most teachers covered by mid-March (see next slide)

# Test Dates and Times

Students will need to take the first exam offered. Those dates are on the following slide.

Students will need to log on to take the exam 30 minutes prior to scheduled test time.

# Technology and Response Submission

- If you do not have access to a device with Internet connection, please contact the College Board by April 24, here:

  - Students must make this request. If students cannot do this, they can ask their AP teacher to submit the request.
- Students will be able to practice uploading responses prior to their test date. This will be a simulation so they are comfortable with submission on test day.
- Students will need to receive and submit their response on the same device.
- Students will have the option of typing their response/s or hand writing their response/s and uploading a picture of their work.
- Students will have an additional 5 minutes for uploading their responses.
- If you encounter a technology issue (e.g., losing power) the student will need to complete a technology request form provided by the College Board

- From the College Board:
  - *Like many college-level exams, this year's AP Exams will be open book/open note. However, students may not consult with any other individuals during the testing period. We will take the necessary steps to protect the integrity of each exam administration, as we do every year.*

# Calculus AB/BC



- Students who are registered to take Calculus BC will not receive an AB sub score this year.

# AP Art 2D/3D and Drawing

## From the College Board:

- *As usual, there will be no end-of-year exam in AP Art and Design. The deadline for submission of artworks in the Digital Portfolio is extended to May 26, 11:59 p.m. ET.*

## Selected Works (40% of grade)

- Students are required to submit 3 works for Selected Works, reduced from 5.
- The 3 submissions should be finished works of art that demonstrate the synthesis of materials, processes, and ideas. The works may come from the Sustained Investigation or they may be works made outside of the Sustained Investigation.

## Sustained Investigation (60% of grade)

- Students are required to submit 10 images for Sustained Investigation, reduced from 15.
- The Sustained Investigation is intended to provide students an opportunity to demonstrate their thinking-and-making process when creating works of art and design. The 10 submissions can be a combination of images of process documentation and more finished works of art.

# Before Test Day

- Be sure to print/have accessible items that will be useful during the exam:
  - Formula Sheets (STEM Courses)
  - Writing Rubrics (Humanities)
- From the College Board:
  - *In late April, we'll provide AP students and educators with information on how to access the testing system on test day, and video demonstrations so that students can familiarize themselves with the system.*

# Action Items for Students

- Students will need to log on to their College Board/AP Student Page and do the following:
  - Verify they are registered with Sprayberry High School (School Code: 112005)
  - Check their “score send” location (college/university)
    - In prior years, students did this on the paper exam. Now they will need to update their profile for their one free score send.
  - Check their email address to verify that it is a reliable email where they can receive information regarding directions for the exam.
    - Students **should not** be using the email provided by Cobb County (...@students.cobbk12.org). This email address does not allow students to receive emails.

# Cancellations

- Any student can choose to cancel their exam(s) without penalty due to the shift in the educational setting following the outbreak of COVID-19.
- Students will not be penalized for cancelling their exams.
- If a student wishes to cancel, they do not need to inform anyone. Simply do not take the exam.
- At Sprayberry, we will have a \$4/cancellation fee to cover administrative costs. Therefore if you paid \$100 for an exam, you will receive a refund of \$96.
- All refunds will be processed through Total Registration. Students and parents will receive the refund on the credit/debit card they used to pay for the exam.
- Refunds will not be processed until the week of June 8<sup>th</sup> (after late testing is complete).
